Centrally Sponsored Schemes

Polytechnic Sector

i. Establishment of 18 New Polytechnics.

- The Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India has sanctioned 18 new Polytechnics during 2009-2010 for un-covered Districts of the J&K State under scheme "Sub-Mission on Polytechnic under coordinated action for Skill Development". The Project Cost of each Polytechnic is ₹ 1300.00 lakhs (₹ 800.00 lakhs as CSS and ₹ 500.00 lakhs as State share) for Civil components and ₹ 430.00 lakhs have been sanctioned as Central sharein addition to Civil cost for procurement of Machinery and Equipment etc for each of these Polytechnics. The total Project cost under the scheme is ₹31140.00 lakhs which includes central share of ₹1230.00 (₹ 800.00 lakhs for Civil works and ₹ 430.00 lakhs for Machinery & Equipment) and State share ₹ 500.00 lakhs for civil works for each Polytechnic. An amount of ₹ 22463.00 lakhs (₹16048.00 as Central share &₹6415.00 lakhs as UT Top-Up) have been released by GoI and State Govt. leaving thereby a balance cost of ₹ 6092.00 lakhs (₹ 2068.00- Civil works &₹ 4024.00—M&E) with the Government of India and ₹2585.00 lakhs with the State Government. The total expenditure incurred under the scheme till date₹22110.26 lakhs (₹15788.94lakhs as Central share and ₹6415.00 lakhs as UT Top-up).
- Out of 18 Polytechnics, 09 Polytechnics are being constructed in <u>Kashmir Division</u> viz. Kupwara, Bandipora, Budgam,, Anantnag, Baramulla, Ganderbal, Kulgam, Shopian, Pulwama and 09 Polytechnics in <u>Jammu Division</u> viz. Doda, Kishtwar, Ramban, Poonch, Udhampur, Reasi, Kathua, Samba and Rajouri.
- Out of these 18, two (02) Polytechnics of District Rajouri and Pulwama have been established in the campus of Baba Ghulam Shah Badshah and Islamic University of Science and Technology Awantipora Pulwama respectively.
- Out of 18 Polytechnics, 09 viz. Govt. Polytechnic Anantnag, Kulgam, Budgam, Baramulla, Bandipora, Ganderbal, Samba, Kathua and Reasi have been shifted to newly constructed buildings. Besides, 04 Polytechnics viz Govt. Polytechnic Shopain, Udhampur, Doda and Ramban shall be completed during the Next financial year.

ii. "Up-gradation of Infrastructural facilities in the existing Polytechnics of the State":

- The scheme was introduced in the state in year 2010-11.
- 04 Govt. Polytechnics viz. Women Polytechnic Srinagar, K.G.P Srinagar, Polytechnic Jammu, & Women Polytechnic Jammu, have been covered under the Scheme.

The Objectives of the Scheme are:

- Providing of modern equipments and replacement of obsolete equipments
- Providing modern facilities for application of IT in teaching learning and testing processes etc.
- Creating infrastructure facilities for introduction of new diploma courses.
- The GoI has so far released ₹ 500.00 lakhs against the approved grant-in-aid of ₹ 676.00 lakhs, leaving thereby a balance of ₹ 176.00 lakhs yet to be released by the Govt. of India. The expenditure incurred till date under the scheme is ₹500.00 lakhs.

iii. Construction of Women Hostels.

- Ministry of HRD, GOI sanctioned 06 women Hostels in Govt. Polytechnics viz.
 Govt. Boys Polytechnic Jammu, Govt. women Polytechnic Jammu, K.G.
 Polytechnics Jammu & Govt. Polytechnic for Women Srinagar,
- Out of the total sanctioned Project cost of ₹ 400.00 lakhs, central assistance of an amount of ₹ 360.00 lakhs have been released and utilized in full, leaving thereby a balance of ₹ 40.00 lakhs yet to be released by the Govt. of India.
- 04 Hostels being constructed under the scheme, all 04 have been completed and functional.

iv. Community Development through Polytechnics.

• CDTP scheme envisages providing non formal, short term, employment oriented skill development programmes, through AICTE approved Polytechnics, to various sections of the community, particularly the rural, unorganized & disadvantaged sections of the society, to enable them to obtain gainful self /

wage employment. Duration of training usually ranges from three to six months. These courses are to be offered by the Polytechnics in their premises, as well as through extension centers, set up in nearby locations, from where, these courses can be offered to the local community. No fee is charged from the trainees under this Scheme and there is no restriction of age and qualification for the trainees.

ITI Sector.

i. Introduction of Hospitality related courses:

- The objective of the Scheme is setting up and up-gradation of institutes of Hotel Management & Catering Technology & Applied Nutrition (IHMs), Food Craft Institutes (FCIs) in the country. In J&K State, 06 ITIs viz. ITI Srinagar, Jammu, Anantnag, Baramulla and Udhampur are covered under the Scheme by way of introduction of Hospitality related courses and upgradation of infrastructure.
- Against the approved central assistance of ₹ 600.00 lakhs (₹ 100.00lakhs for each ITI), for construction of workshop blocks, GOI has so far released ₹ 510.00 lakhs, , leaving thereby a balance of ₹ 90.00 lakhs with the Govt. of India. An expenditure of ₹ 491.63 lakhs have been incurred till date under the scheme. All the workshop blocks taken up under the scheme are near completion.
